o Expenses for pizza and subway are not updated, so once reconciled, the net amounts will decrease

- Question: What amount can be left in the school council budget at the end of the year?
  - a. Response: the money needs to be spent/earmarked for something as funds collected during this year need to be spent/accounted for.
- Our school is a digital school- Chromebooks and smartboards were installed years ago and are approaching time periods where repairs/replacements are needed- there are several Chromebooks that are going to need fixing very soon
- Motion for approval: Request to earmark \$5,000 for technology from the budget, as long there is a minimum of \$5,000 in the school council budget for the upcoming school year
  - a. Vote: unanimous vote of approval
- Question: Are funds budgeted to pay for outdoor maintenancefixing nets, painting, etc.? Can we get nets for the basketball nets outside?
  - a. **Response:** outdoor expenses on the budget are allocated for soccer balls, bouncy balls, improvement of pavement, triple hoop
    - Unable to install nets on basketball nets due to potential liability
    - ii. Will inquire about getting a work order for nets for the triple hoops outside

# 9. New Business

- Question- "Teacher appreciation" was last week, at the same time as catholic education week. Were teachers highlighted this year?- A parent sent a card with their child, and the teacher wasn't aware
  - Response: Yes, had a thank you BBQ with the ice cream truck last week.
    Our board has St. Joseph's Day of the Worker- celebrate everyone on the board.
- Question- Will there be gluten-free options at the BBQ?
  - o **Response:** Unsure, will be following up to think of an option
- Question: What are the end-of-school day procedures? I was a few minutes late, and my child (grade 3) was there alone.
  - o **Response:** Grade 1 and 2- it's supervised handoffs
    - Grade 3- they go to the kiss and ride themselves; if it's from the backdoor, one teacher is supervising them, and they should be brought to the office if no one is there to pick them up.

- Information regarding end-of-school day procedures is shared with parents at the beginning of the school year.
- **Suggestion**: Keep this listed in the newsletter or send out a notice to parents as a reminder.
- Question: Can you rent the gym out?
  - o **Response**: yes, there is a fee; contact the school board to book space
- Question: Regarding water fountains, some students have expressed concern about the fountain water being cloudy; therefore, they would like to get water at the filtered water station. Can they be allowed to go to the filtered fountain?
  - Response: there are 3 water stations at the school, 2 upstairs and 1 on the main floor; 1 on the main floor has a filter system; kids want to go to different fountains; the school team runs all water fountains every morning before students come in; will discuss an approach to support students who are concerned
